Sheep's Head Lighthouse

Sheep's Head Lighthouse,

which marks the southern tip of Bantry Bay, was built in 1968 as a consequence of the development of the oil terminal at Whiddy Island. The design of the lighthouse is similar to Achillbeg, built in 1965.

cause of the remoteness of Sheep's Head (also called Muntervary) and the lack of a road, the building materials and equipment for the lighthouse were lifted from Kilcrohane (9km away) to the site by helicopter. About 250 lifts were needed.

The lighthouse comprises a 7 metre high white round tower on a square building. The lantern is 83 metres above sea level. The lighthouse was put into operation for the first time on 14th October 1968. The operation of the lighthouse was originally monitored by the Keepers at Mizen Head Lighthouse through a UHF radio link.
